Introduction

To have a family can in some sense be compared to running a business together – there are a lot of practicalities to take care of, not least economic ones. Different ways to budget in families

Personal economy: each one has their separate bank account

Shared economy: a shared account with shared income and expenses

- Do you think your system works well?
- Are there big differences in income in your family?

Go through your family budget. Make a document with income and expenses for a month. Are there any surprising revelations? Is it fairly distributed? Also consider costs for hobbies, free-time, clothes etc.
